Woodstove Wizardry?

Many of us enjoy the warmth of our woodstoves during the winter – especially on those cold clear nights. Concern about air pollution has been expressed by residents however, and was a topic of discussion at our last Council Conversation Café.

Localized air pollution from burning wood can be due to several factors. By following some basic guidelines, you can help keep our air quality high and save money. In order to ensure clean and efficient wood burning, here are a few tips:

- Use properly seasoned wood. Make sure you know where your wood is coming from and that it has dried for at least 6-12 months.
- Never burn anything but firewood and a small amount of newspaper.
- Ensure you have good airflow and don't turn your stove down until the firewood is at charcoal state. Don't let your fire smolder.
- Have your stove and chimney cleaned annually.
- Use a high efficiency certified woodstove.
 New Denver participates in the Wood Stove
 Exchange Program that offers residents a
 financial incentive to replace your old,
 inefficient stove. Contact the Village regarding
 this rebate.

In December, the community celebrated the 26 years of service of Public Works' staff Mike Simpson. He has retired and we thank him for his commitment and care of our community. Carol Gordon will retire this spring after 27 years of dedicated work managing the many aspects of our Village. These are large shoes to fill.

While staff transitions and finding the appropriate organizational structure is challenging, Council has been working closely with staff to plan and prepare for these changes. You can look forward to some announcements soon.

As part of this transition, we are conducting a pilot of open office hours, as well as closing the Village office for one week for some important administrative work to be completed before Carol leaves.

Recycling Drop-off Change is Coming

A couple of years ago the Province advised the producers of recyclable material that come May 2014 producers would be responsible for the costs and operations of recycling. Out of this was born the Multi-Materials (MMBC) packaging regulations. Due to the requirements of this program, RDCK is negotiating with MMBC to have our recycling handled by the Transfer Stations run by the RDCK. Our closest site is the Rosebery Transfer Station. This new program does not include commercial recycling, however MMBC will be deducting 25% off the top of their payments to the

operator on the assumption that there will be commercial recycling at the bins. This means it is imperative that businesses continue to add their recycling to the bins. There is still much to be sorted out and confirmed, but we will continue to keep everyone up to date as we learn more details.
