Thank you for submitting an application under the 2020 Poverty Reduction Planning & Action grant program.

I am pleased to inform you **in confidence** that the Evaluation Committee has approved funding for your project, *Stream 1 - New Denver Poverty Reduction Plan*, in the amount of \$16.885.

A payment in the amount of \$8,442.50 will follow by electronic funds transfer <u>after the signed Approval Agreement has been returned to UBCM</u>. This amount represents 50 percent of the total approved grant. The remaining 50 percent, or eligible final payment, will be available after a satisfactory final report and financial summary have been submitted to UBCM.

The Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction has provided funding for this program and the general Terms & Conditions are attached. In addition, in order to satisfy the terms of the contribution agreement, we have the following requirements:

- (3) The funding is to be used solely for the purpose of the above-named project and for the expenses itemized in the budget that was approved as part of your application;
- (4) All expenditures must meet eligibility requirements as defined in the Program & Application Guide;
- (5) All project activities must be completed within one year of the date of this approval agreement and no later than May 14, 2021;

The Poverty Reduction Planning & Action Program is funded by the Province of BC

- (6) The Final Report Form is required to be submitted to UBCM within 30 days of project end date and no later than June 14, 2021;
- (7) Any unused funds must be returned to UBCM within 30 days following the project end date.

Please note that descriptive information regarding successful applicants will be posted on the UBCM and/or provincial government websites, and all final report materials will be made available to the provincial government.

On behalf of the Evaluation Committee, I would like to congratulate you for responding to this opportunity to reduce poverty at the local level and to support the Province's poverty reduction strategy.

SUBJECT: West Kootenay Renewable Energy Plan Update

PURPOSE: To provide Council with an update on the EcoSociety-led Regional Energy Leaders Working Group and the development of a West Kootenay 100% Renewable Energy Plan.

ANALYSIS:

A. Background:

At their January 22, 2019 Regular Meeting, the Council of the Village of New Denver adopted Resolution #25 that the Village of New Denver commits to transition to 100% renewable energy no later than 2050; and further, that staff be directed to present Council with options for the establishment of a Committee which includes community representatives, to work towards this goal.

At their July 9, 2020 Regular Meeting, the Council of the Village of New Denver adopted Resolution #260 that the Village of New Denver sign the Memorandum of Understanding with the West Kootenay EcoSociety to join the Regional Energy Leaders Working Group to ensure that the needs of New Denver residents and property owners are considered in the development of plans and strategies. Other participants in this working group include the Regional District of Central Kootenay and the municipalities of Castlegar, Kaslo, Nelson, Rossland, Silverton, Slocan, and Warfield.

Terms of Reference for a Sustainability Advisory Committee were adopted by the Council of the Village of New Denver at Council's Regular Meeting of April 9, 2019.

Over the past year, the West Kootenay 100% Renewable Energy Plan has been developed by the Regional Energy Leaders Working Group consisting of staff and elected leaders from the partner local governments, facilitated by the West Kootenay EcoSociety with support from Community Energy Association and Renewable Cities. This working group has been meeting every 1-2 months since April 2019 and has participated in webinars with experts leading in renewable energy, energy efficiency, and low-carbon community planning.

Community engagement around the development of the West Kootenay 100% Renewable Energy Plan took place between November 2019 and March 2020 in Rossland, Silverton/New Denver, Slocan, Castlegar, Nelson, and Warfield. A survey asking community members to share their ideas, priorities and concerns about a transition to 100% renewable energy is open until June 6, 2020; input collected through the survey will be integrated into the plan.

The draft West Kootenay 100% Renewable Energy Plan will be released to local government partners early summer. Once released, participating local governments will be asked to review the draft Plan and provide feedback, particularly regarding community specific information in Part 3: Local Government Actions. Local experts from across the region in the energy and electrification, transportation, buildings, waste, and worker transition sectors will be convened from June through November to review the draft plan, make suggestions, and develop next steps toward implementation. A revised draft plan will be distributed for public comment before the plan is finalized. A final plan is intended to be distributed by December 1, 2020.

A. Discussion: Through upcoming review of the draft West Kootenay 100% Renewable Energy Plan by the EcoSociety and the Working Group, community members and key stakeholders across the region will further

be engaged, using adaptations as required to accommodate Covid-19 health and safety precautions, to review the draft plan and provide further input. The Council of the Village of New Denver will be invited to contribute feedback and distribute the draft plan to the public for review.

The Village of New Denver's Sustainability Committee is well positioned to participate in the review of the draft plan and provide recommendations about the West Kootenay 100% Renewable Energy Plan to Council.

PURPOSE: To seek Council authorization to issue a Grant-in-Aid to the Lucerne Association for Community

Education

RECOMMENDATION:

That a grant in aid of \$2500 be provided to the Lucerne Association for Community Education, to cover the cost of hydro for the Bosun Hall.

ALTERNATIVES & IMPLICATIONS:

- 1. Provide a grant-in-aid. A cheque will be issued to LACE so that they can pay BC Hydro.
- 2. Do not provide a grant-in-aid. LACE will be required to pay the hydro costs for the Bosun Hall

ANALYSIS:

- A. Background: The Lucerne Association for Community Education (LACE) operates the Bosun Hall on behalf of the Village of New Denver, providing a venue for community events such as May Days, memorials, weddings, Girl Guides, the Food Hamper program and other activities. LACE funds much of this work with proceeds from the Donation Store. With the temporary closure of the Donation Store due to the COVID-19 pandemic, LACE is facing financial shortfalls. They are seeking a grant-in-aid from the Village to cover the annual BC Hydro charges for the facility. Annual BC Hydro costs for the Bosun Hall amount to approximately \$2500.
- **B. Discussion**: As the owner of the building, the Village is ultimately responsible for the maintenance of the Bosun Hall. The Village already covers the cost of BC Hydro service for all the other municipal facilities that are operated by local volunteer groups. The request for a grant-in-aid was received in 2019 and was considered during budget discussions. Now that budget has been adopted, a Council resolution is required to authorize the issuance of the grant-in-aid.

SUBJECT: CARPENTER CREEK GREEN BURIAL GROUND

PURPOSE: To seek direction from Council about whether to explore options for green burials in the New Denver Cemetery

OPTIONS:

- 1. Direct staff to meet with the Carpenter Creek Last Wishes Society to discuss the matter and refine the request.
- 2. Advise the Carpenter Creek Last Wishes Society the Village is not interested at this time. No further action will be taken.

ANALYSIS:

- **A. Background**: The New Denver Cemetery is owned and operated by the Village of New Denver. It is licenced through Consumer Protection BC and must comply with the provincial Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Act and the Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Regulation.
- **B. Discussion**: Currently the Village of New Denver does not allow burial in a shroud, requiring a rigid container, as per S. 9(d) of the Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Regulation. However, green burials are not prohibited in BC. Changes to existing policy and practice will be explored at Council's direction.
- **C. Legislative Framework**: Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Act and the Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Regulation.

Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Act

Containers for interment or cremation

- 11 Unless permitted by the regulations, a funeral provider and an operator must not refuse to accept or handle a container to enclose human remains that
- (a) is supplied by a person other than the operator and the funeral provider, and
- (b) meets the requirements of the regulations and any requirements under the *Public Health Act*.

Cremation, Interment and Funeral Services Regulation

Requirements for containers referred to in section 11 of the Act

- 9 A container referred to in section 11 of the Act must meet the following requirements:
- (a) it must have sufficient strength to contain and move human remains;
- (b) it must be capable of being closed so that the public is not able to see the human remains;
- (c) it must be constructed so that it does not leak or otherwise cause a hazard to any person's health;
- (d) it must be rigid.

SUBJECT: Province of BC Referral Request on an Alpine Skiing Expression of Interest

PURPOSE: To provide Council with information for use in responding to an Expression of Interest submitted to the Mountain Resort Branch of the BC Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (MFLNRORD) for the development of a year-round lift-accessed ski resort to be located east of New Denver.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Council of the Village of New Denver direct staff to respond to the referral from BC's Mountain Resort Branch indicating an interest in being involved and informed should the proposal proceed.

ALTERNATIVES & IMPLICATIONS:

- 1. That Council request staff respond in greater detail regarding the land or related concerns based on the proposed development of a resort. This would require additional staff time and direction from Council.
- 2. That Council not provide a response to the Zincton EOI referral request. This may result in the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development inferring that the Village is not concerned with providing input into this proposed.

ANALYSIS:

A. Background:

Expression of Interest Review & Referral

An Expression of Interest (EOI) means a written statement of interest from a proponent or prospective applicant to Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations, and Rural Development (FLNRORD) identifying the area of interest, the nature and scale of proposed development, and general information on management structure, technical design and financial capability to carry out the project. This referral from the Mountain Resorts Branch (MRB) of MFLNRORD ('the Ministry') is preliminary in nature, as the Ministry has not formally accepted the EOI being considered.

MRB has requested comments from the Village of New Denver on interests on the land itself or any related concerns based on the proposed development of a resort. Following the receipt of all comments and identification of any land-use conflicts, included those provided by the public in response to advertising this EOI, feasibility of the project will be determined. If feasible, a Formal Proposal would be submitted and if accepted by the Ministry would initiate a more intensive and detailed review and planning process consistent with the ASRP and the All-Seasons Resort Guidelines. For this reason, no detailed project design has been included with the referral.

Zincton Expression of Interest, May 2020


The Zincton EOI was submitted to the Province in May 2020 by Brent Harley and Associates Inc. (BHA) on behalf of David Harley, to develop an all-season resort along London Ridge and Whitewater Ridge, near New Denver. The Zincton all-season resort would be accessed from Highway 31A near Three Forks, approximately 8km east of New Denver.

The EOI Executive Summary indicates that: "The Mountain Village and a portion of the recreation facilities (e.g. ski trails, mountain bike trails) will be developed on private land adjacent to the proposed Controlled

Recreation Area. Combined with lift-serviced skiing at either end, guests will create their own personal mix of accommodation between the Mountain Village and the remote Backcountry Lodge, and lift-serviced and backcountry recreation experiences, both guided and unguided." The EOI addresses Crown land and is separate from the proposed Zincton development on Private Land, presented to Council in April 2020.

The following aerial photo and study area boundary is extracted from the Zincton EOI Executive Summary:





The 68-page EOI touches on considerations such as existing commercial recreation interests, overlapping public recreation, existing resource interests, ski slope analysis, mountain bike slope analysis, elevation analysis, aspect analysis, base slope analysis, climatological analysis, terrain capacity analysis, existing environmental conditions, and visual impact. Detailed analyses of these considerations are not provided at this early stage.

Discussion:

The May 13, 2020 invitation by MRB to comment on the Zincton EOI has generated a fair amount of public interest and discussion. A variety of media outlets have published stories on the subject and local residents have posted public comments, online and in the local newspaper, regarding the proposal. Opinions are mixed. Some area residents are in support of the proposal, some are opposed, and some await additional studies and reports to make an informed decision. Both benefits and concerns have been identified.

A non-exclusive Licence of Occupation for an Extensive Use Area, under the Adventure Tourism Policy, is a standard form of tenure for adventure tourism operators conducting guiding activities in the area. This type of use does not exclude public access from the tenured Crown land. Public access within Controlled Recreation Areas on the other hand, is managed by the operator under agreement with the Province.

Should the Zincton proposal proceed, proposed development would have an impact on local services in New Denver. Given this, along with the potential for restricted access to popular recreational land in the area and the need for further studies, it would be of benefit for the Village to remain informed and involved.

Legislative Framework: BC's Land Act and Ministry of Lands, Parks and Housing Act.

The Province of BC's All-Seasons Resort Land Use Operational Policy applies to All-Seasons Resort Development projects that take place on Crown upland and/or aquatic land, including Alpine Ski Resorts. Crown land requires removal from the Provincial Forest prior to disposition under the Ministry of Lands, Parks and Housing Act.
