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## **2022 PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT**

- ◆ 2022 Property Tax due date is **Friday, July 15, 2022** for all properties. After this time, a **10% penalty** will be applied to all unpaid taxes including unclaimed Home Owner Grants. Please allow sufficient time for delivery by mail. **Postmarks will not be accepted as date of payment.**
- ◆ All payments must be made in **Canadian funds** by cash, cheque, debit, or e-transfer. E-transfers may be made to [accounting@newdenver.ca](mailto:accounting@newdenver.ca) – please provide a password to the security question of your choice in a separate email.
- ◆ The Village of New Denver accepts post-dated cheques for payments in full or installments, after property tax notices have been issued. A 10% penalty will still apply to any portion unpaid after July 15, 2022. Property tax PREPAYMENTS (for the following year) **CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.**
- ◆ **Kootenay Savings Credit Union** customers may make payments through KSCU’s online Banking system using the following information:
  - Payments> Add Payee> Search by Payee Name> search New Denver> select *NEW DENVER, VILLAGE – PROPERTY TAX*
  - Enter Account #: *(Please enter your Roll Number, from your tax notice)*
  - Home Owner Grants cannot be claimed through KSCU online.
  - Home Owner Grants are to be claimed directly with the province. Please apply online or over the phone. **You may reach them By Phone at 1-888-355-2700 or Online at [Gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant](http://Gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant)**

- ◆ The Province of BC offers **Property Tax Deferral** Programs. You may qualify if you are:
  - 55 or older during the current year OR
  - A person with disabilities OR
  - Supporting a child

If you defer your property taxes, you still need to claim your Home Owner Grant if you are eligible. More information about Property Tax Deferral is available online from the Province (search “Defer Your Property Taxes BC”).
