

Tour Information

The Nikkei Interment Memorial Centre (NIMC) is a National Historic Site dedicated to telling the story of over 22,000 Japanese Canadians who were forcibly relocated during World War II. Located on the site of "The Orchard" internment camp, the NIMC contains original buildings, period artifacts and interpretive displays as well as the Heiwa Teien Peace Garden, designed by the renowned Japanese Canadian gardener, Tomomichi (Roy) Sumi.

Self-guided tours

We welcome school tours, large groups and bus tours from May 1st to Sept 30. Due to limited staff capacity, we do not offer guided tours of the site. The museum attendant on site, may, if time allows, give a short overview of the site prior to the self guided portion of the experience. Self-guided tours take less than an hour.
